

Autofill, Clear





Autofill

- ❑ It fill an adjacent group of cells with the same text or numbers, or with text or numbers that form a series.
- ❑ Both require you to first highlight a range of cells, starting will the cell containing the text or numbers you want copied to the other cells.





- ❑ Put the mouse pointer over the bottom right-hand corner of the cell until it's a black plus sign.
- ❑ Click and hold the left mouse button, and drag the plus sign over the cells you want to fill.
- ❑ And the series is filled in for you automatically using the AutoFill feature.

Clear

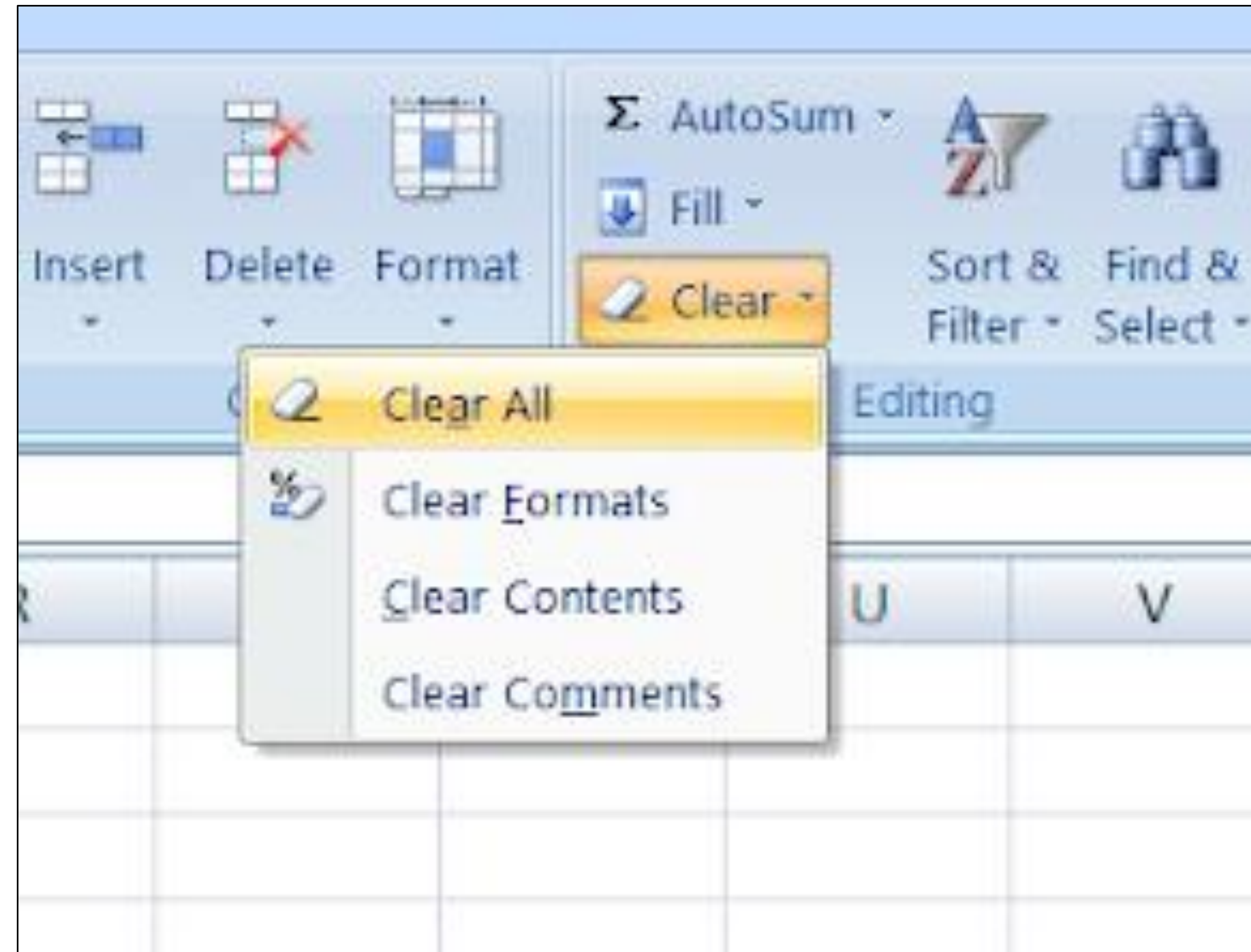
- ❑ This Excel command can clear content, formats, comments, and hyperlinks from the selected cells.
- ❑ To clear all contents, formats, and comments that are contained in the selected cells, click **Clear All**.





- ❑ To clear only the formats that are applied to the selected cells, click **Clear Formats**.
- ❑ To clear only the contents in the selected cells, leaving any formats and comments in place, click **Clear Contents**.
- ❑ To clear any comments or notes that are attached to the selected cells, click **Clear Comments**.
