




On and under




On is used to indicate that something is resting on top of or in contact with another object.

Under


Under is used to indicate that something is below or beneath another object.



The apple is under the table.










The leaves on the tree were green in colour

The cycle is parked under the tree.










The dog is sitting on the coach.



The newspaper lay under the coach










The keys are on the chair.




The keys fell under the chair.










The apples are growing on the tree.
