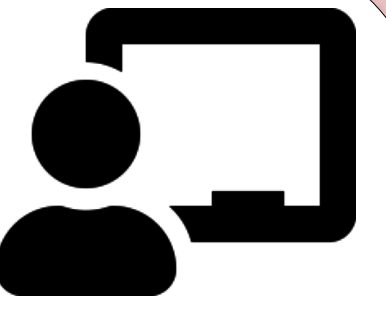

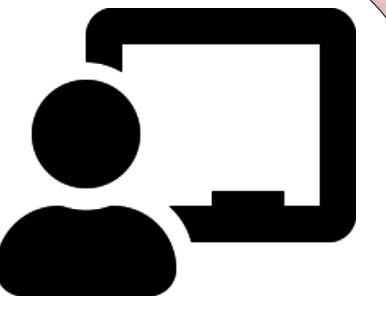




# Money

- Money is a way to **measure value**.
- We can **buy and sell** things in terms of **money units**. It is called an **exchange**.
- Money is something generally accepted as a way to **pay for goods and services**.
- Currency denominations and systems **differ internationally**.
- **Euro** in Paris, **Rupee** in India, **Dollar** in America, **Dirham** in U.A.E, **Real** in Brazil and **Pound** in London.

## Paper money

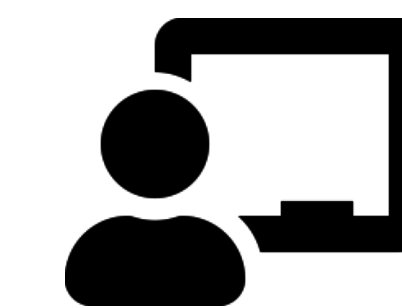
American paper currency comes in seven denominations: **\$1, \$2, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, and \$100.**

## U.S coins

United States coins denominations include **1¢, 5¢, 10¢, 25¢, 50¢, and \$1.**

## Penny

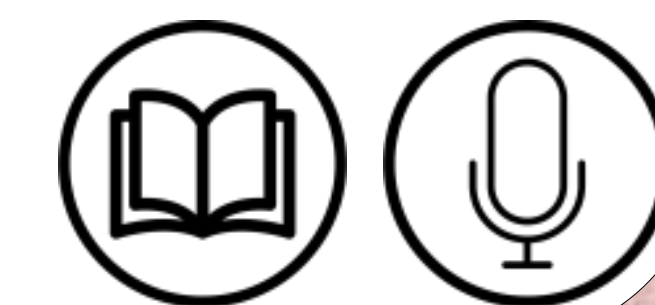


1 Penny = 1 cent  
= 1¢

## Nickel



1 Nickel = 5 cents  
= 5¢



## Dime



1 Dime = 10 cents  
= 10¢

## Quarter



1 Quarter = 25 cents  
= 25¢

## Half Dollar



1 Half Dollar = 50 cents  
= 50¢

## Dollar



1 dollar = 100 cents  
= 100¢ = \$1

## Dollar



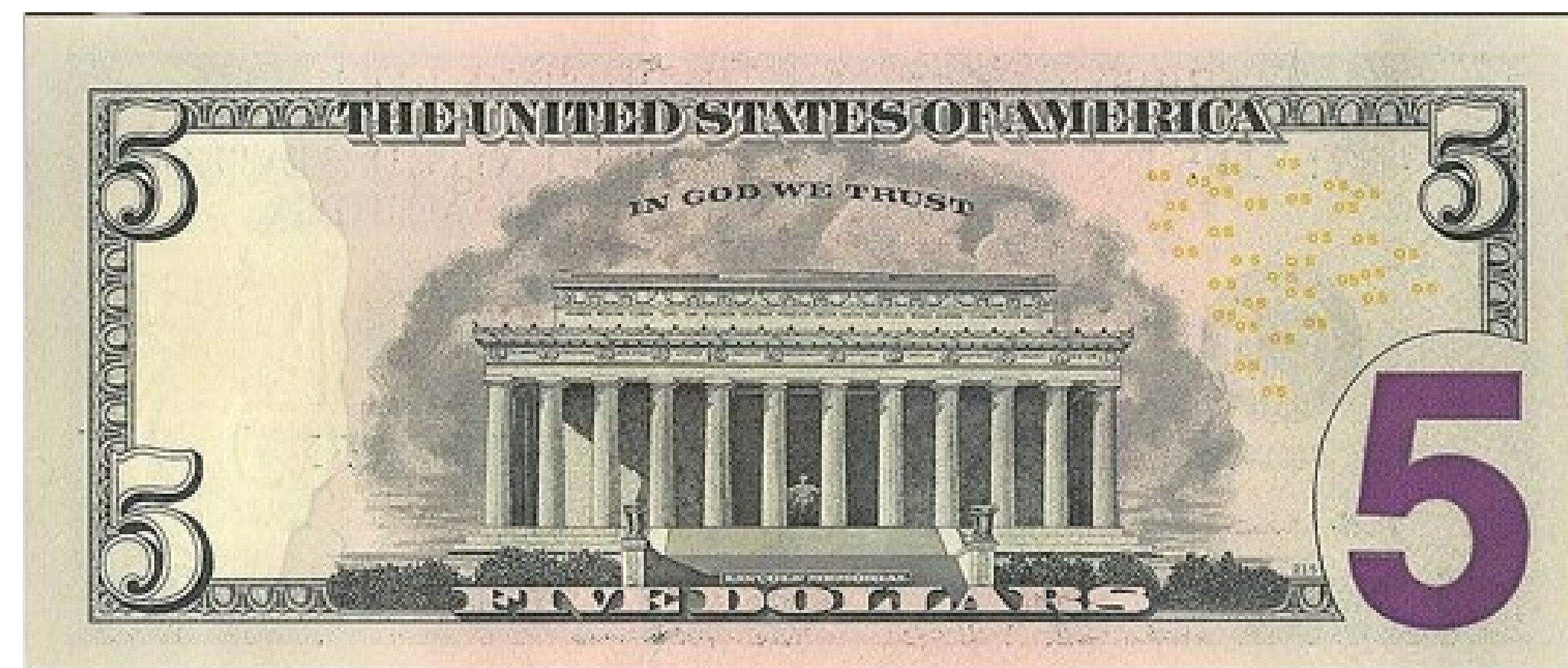
1 dollar = 100 cents
